Revision of Minutes from last meeting:

- 1) Event with ESF – voluntary, happening outside of school in Frankfurt.
- 2) Eurosports Training – 20 boys and 20 girls have been pre-selected S4 and above. Final 10 boys and 10 girls will be selected next year after a training camp.
- 3) Rugby Team – runs from September to November. After that it does not run due to weather conditions. Can the rugby club train beyond November. Students are only interested in competitions and there are no competitions beyond November except against FIS. In the past, there were only friendly matches with FIS. Good to investigate opportunities from Deutschland Rugby for next academic year. School management would like to have more rugby.
- 4) Parents need to be informed when the sports hall is not used – Secondary needs to send it out.

Punkte der Sekundarschule

1. Sport activities during breaks
Sports activities during breaks with Mr. Rodwell – it was great to see students come from different classes. There were lunchtime football tournaments. People from different classes competed against each other. There were also games in basketball and frisbee. It was great to have someone outside, engaging with them. Many students played outside. Should this pilot project be kept for next year? Parents like the supervised group dynamics outside and there are less conflicts that evolve.



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2. Afternoon Clubs – Second Semester Summary
Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Football. The badminton club will not run in the second semester due to insufficient numbers.
3. Tournaments:
 - a. Football - the result was not the best, but there were three different teams that signed up. U-16 won the first phase but lost the second phase
 - b. Volleyball - won first phase but lost second phase
 - c. Badminton - won first two phases, but did not qualify in the Hessen finals
 - d. Basketball - U-18 qualified to go to 2. Round. U-16 made it to Landesentscheid – furthest we have come from the school. We came in fourth overall. Team was made up of ESRM and ISRM
 - e. We hosted the following tournaments in the school:
 - i. JTFO Volleyball – an initiative by Mr. Rodwell
 - ii. Basketball tournament – MSF and ESF were invited with two teams each (U-16 and U-18). Our school won both competitions.
 - iii. Christmas volleyball competition between students and teachers. Students enjoy challenging the teachers. Students won.
 - iv. Golf competition – June 16.
 - v. Frisbee Tournament – July 1 (Secondary Sports Day).

Punkte der Primarschule

1. Cricket
One of the big successes this year was the set-up of the girl's cricket team – very committed girls from P5-S5. Only girls team in Germany. The girl's cricket team enjoy the social scene as well. We won the Indoor Hessenmeisterschaft for U12 and U-14 – scored 167. German school tournament on 13.06. in Cologne – we will compete with three teams in the under-category and two teams in the older category. Training is on Mondays from 15h00 – 18h00.
