SPORTS CLASS - New Rule



8.2.2.3.3

Exemptions from regular participation at Physical Education lessons.

If candidates are exempted from regular participation during one or both semesters,

exemption from the Physical Education class will be compensated by active participation to the course through other activities, adapted to the condition of the pupil, decided by the teacher, such as time keeping, acting as referee, written assignment, etc.

The same applies for B-marks in line with the dispositions of article 6.3.3.

The same applies to the complementary course of Sports.


Absences 10% Rule



Art. 30. b) iv.

If, at the end of the first semester, the number of absences seems likely to exceed the threshold of 10% of the periods actually organised in one or more subjects, the Director will warn the pupil's legal representatives of the risk of non-promotion or of being unable to sit the Baccalaureate examinations.



- DP exams concentrated in weeks in Semester 1 and Semester 2




Bring Your Own Device/ AI policy

AI Policy




- Responsible use of AI in an ethical way, allowing for data protection and copyright, privacy rights according to EU and German regulations
- AI cannot replace independent work or critical-thinking
- AI can provide biased/ incorrect information
- AI tools (preferably closed) can be used to:
 - Brainstorm ideas for essays or projects
 - Get explanations on academic material
 - Practice languages, digital and math skills
 - Practice problem-solving and critical-thinkins skills
 - Draft codes or technical solutions (with citation)



AI Policy



- **AI CANNOT** be used to:
 - **Submit AI-generated content (text, images, codes, projects, presentations, music, videos) as own work without disclosure**
 - **Use AI during exams/ tests/ assessments**
 - **Use AI in assessments, unless clearly asked to do so by the teacher**
 - **Bypass learning activities or plagiarize**
 - **Process or share personal data of others without consent**



AI Policy



- Students clearly label AI-generated content in the following way:

In the creation of the following content (text/image/code/music/ video),
(name of AI platform, e.g. ChatGPT) was used.

I gave the following prompts/questions to navigate AI: 1._____, 2._____, 3._____.

- burden of proof of knowledge. Teachers may ask questions to assess the independent work of students in projects.
- Teachers need to clearly state when homework/ assignments are given whether the use of AI is allowed or not. Bias.
- Unauthorized and/or undisclosed use of AI in assignments is plagiarism



AI Policy




Teacher Responsibilities

- **Teach students about responsible AI use**
- **Raise awareness about the opportunities and risks of AI use (e.g. bias)**
- **Design assessments that discourage AI use**
- **Encourage critical thinking and verification of AI-generated content**

Data Protection

- **Only tools that comply with GDPR may be used**
- **No sensitive student data (grades, health, identity) entered into AI systems without legal basis and consent**



Student absences



- Only School Director can give special permission to be absent for reasons other than sickness (t.zijlstra@es-rm.eu)
- Use address: abwesend.sekundar@es-rm.net
- PAs monitor S absence and inform parents of unjustified absences
- Late: S comes in first 10 minutes after lesson has started
- 3 lates = detention
- Repeated absences can lead to a disciplinary hearing/ non-promotion
- Sick students require a medical note as of Day 3
- Absence on a B-Test/Pre-BAC day needs a medical note on same day

European Baccalaureate



Minimum Entry Requirements

Overall 60%, including grade 6 in six distinct recognised subjects including English, mathematics and another language.

English Language Competence

6 in 1st Language, or in 1st or 2nd Foreign language or see full list of acceptable English Language qualifications above.

Specific course requirements

If a course has a requirement of a grade H4 at higher Leaving Certificate level, students presenting EB must present the subject at grade 7 or better. To satisfy a requirement of a grade H3 at higher Leaving Certificate level students presenting EB must present the subject at grade 8 or better.

Indicative Points Equivalence

Students are ranked on the basis of their six best distinct recognised subjects from one sitting of the EB Exam. Points for each 3, 4 & 5hr subject = the points awarded to the higher level Leaving Certificate grade in the same percentage range. Points for each 2hr subject = the points awarded to the ordinary level Leaving Certificate grade in the same percentage range.
